Better Together

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Art Docent: Classroom volunteers teach a specific artist or painting and lead the children in an art project once a month.

Box Tops: Promote our box top program, assist with collection and processing of box tops collected. We submit box tops twice a year.

Brick Pavers: Leave your mark on Little Cedars with the purchase of an 8" x 8" paver with your personal message. Volunteers needed for advertising and installation.

Carnival: Spring event at the school: carnival games, food, vendor booths, crafts, cake walk and fun. Lots of volunteers needed for planning, setup, and supervising activities.

Celebration of the Arts: Night showcasing art made by students throughout the year.

Cultural Night: Families research a culture or share their own, and bring something to share with their fellow students and community.

Fall Dance Party: A night where the kids can dress up, dance, and enjoy other activities. Special guest: The Dance Man!

Gingerbread Decorating Party: Families gather for gingerbread cookie decorating, warm drinks, and a holiday movie showing.

Grandparents Day: Grandparents/Special Seniors join their students at school for refreshments and a welcome from our principal.

Lego Club: Students meet twice a month after school to build Lego creations with other brick fans.

Mornings with Your Superman (formerly Dads & Donuts): Parent and Parent-Figures enjoy the morning with their kids (and eat donuts) and then walk their child to their classroom. This event happens in fall and spring, with one parent coming each season.

Popcorn and Popsicles Sales: Weekly sales of popcorn (Thurs.) and popsicles (Tues.) at recess.

Reflections: National PTA program to celebrate arts learning in our school community. This year's theme is "Heroes Around Me." Volunteers needed for judging, advertising, and preparing art to advance to state.

Robotics Club: 4th - 6th graders program robots and collaborate to solve a real world problem each year in First Lego League.

School Directory: PTA-sponsored student directory created each fall and distributed to each family. Excel guru needed for layout.

School Supply Kits: School supply kits are available for purchase at the end of the previous school year as a service to families.

Science Fair: Science Fair projects are displayed in the evening at LCE. Volunteers are needed for advertising and publications, student sign up, placement and awards, as well as general setup and takedown.

Science Docents: Volunteer run program with the purpose of engaging all level of students and encourage curiosity of the scientific process. Volunteers help deliver pre-planned science labs to classrooms.

Skate Deck: Held at Everett Skate Deck. Volunteers are needed for publications, set up and clean up.

Spelling Bee: As part of Scripps National Spelling Bee program, LCE 4th-6th graders can participate for a chance to advance to next level.

Spirit Wear: You can purchase Little Cedars apparel and show your school sprit on monthly Spirit days. Volunteers needed for designing shirts, managing orders, or selling during school events.

Staff Appreciation Week: Week of appreciation for our staff and teachers at LCE who do so much for our students and families. Volunteers needed for decorating, help providing food, and setup/clean-up.

Talent Show: Family show where students of all grades can showcase their talents on-stage. Volunteers coordinate practices, create programs, supervise students backstage, run the sound system, and support our enthusiastic stars.

Teacher Conference Meals: Family-provided meals and snacks for teachers during busy conference weeks.

WatchDOGS: WatchDOGS are fathers, grandfathers, uncles, and other father-figures who volunteer for at least one day each year at the school.

Yearbook: This committee produces an annual yearbook available for purchase by students and staff, delivered in June.
